

Space open on Managers Council

Petitioning is now open for a position on the five member WPGU Managerial Council. Petitions for the position of program director must be in to the station manager by April 26--no later.

All persons who petition for the position will be interviewed by an Appointment Board, consisting of the managers and the station's advisor, Mr. Paul Doebel, and the Board will select the new managers.

The person selected holds office until April, 1961. There are only two qualifications for membership on the managerial council: (1) The individual must have been a member of the station staff for at least one semester, and (2) The individual must not be on university probation.

Petitions must include the following information:

- (1) Name and class or year at the University.
- (2) College and major.
- (3) Grade Point average.
- (4) Experience related to the position.
- (5) Reasons for wanting the position, and suggestions for any possible changes in the department concerned.

Complete petitioning instructions are on the main bulletin board at the station. Questions about the position, or about the petitioning procedure can be referred to the station manager, or to the present acting program director.
