station, in addition to being broadcast over WPGU. WPGU reporters also covered the other developments in the Koch case, including on-the-spot interviews with students taking part in demonstrations on Saturday, April 9.

Then Sunday, April 10, Professor Koch was a guest on the WPGU news program "Behind the Headlines", and portions of that program were used, along with special interviews, on a special documentary report "The Case of Dr. Koch", which was presented on Sunday evening, April 10. The "Behind the Headlines" program itself was presented on Monday, April 11.
